OLD PARACHUTE ALTITUDE RECORD CHALLENGED

After nearly 50 years, the days may be numbered for United States Air Force Colonel (Ret.) Joseph Kittinger's record 102,800-ft parachute jump from a balloon. Extreme sportsman Felix Baumgartner, of Austria, announced late last week he will try to break Kittinger's all-time record jump by skydiving from a balloon from an altitude of at least 120,000 ft. What's more, it's likely that during his five-minute freefall Baumgartner will become the first person to exceed the speed of sound with his own body.
