## **Airwaves**

I don't know about you but I've had enough "wind" training. I guess we should be thankful it hasn't been tornadic velocities as in many parts of the country. A few key points to remember when landing is to fly it down to the 'level off' altitude with enough airspeed to maintain control. Make it behave! Cut the throttle and work to keep it straight with the rudder, ailerons for the centerline and slight nose up for the touchdown. Do not give up! Do not let the nose wheel touch first. Try to work for full aileron deflection into the wind after touchdown and keep it going straight with the rudder. Taxi slowly and be diligent on aileron and elevator positioning while taxiing. Don't forget to breathe :) I love the challenge when it's windy so if you want someone to help you build your confidence on a gusty day, just give me a call. It'll be FUN, I promise!

Our April EAA meeting was well attended and Dale Jorgenson gave an interesting and informative presentation on his experiences as our technical advisor. Thanks again Dale.
